Official Minutes of the Pierz City Council
June 25, 2018

Members Present: Toby Egan, Dave Fischer, Stephanie Fyten, Mike Menden, Kyle Bednar and Linda Sczublewski.

The City Council Work Session was called to order at 6:00 p.m. at Pierz City Hall by Mayor Toby Egan.

RICH PRAIRIE SEWER & WATER DISTRICT SHARED SERVICES WITH THE CITY:

Discussion was held regarding sharing utility billing services with RPSWD. RPSWD Part-Time help will be retiring in January and RPSWD is in need of someone handling their water and sewer billing. A tentative agreement has been created between the City and RPSWD. Some of the details include RPSWD paying the City's Deputy Clerk 1.5 of her wage for 5 hours a week, and the City invoicing RPSWD for any supplies utilized for billing. The Agreement has not been approved by the RPSWD Board, nor has it been run by the City's Attorney, or approved by the City Council. Council Member Stephanie Fyten stated Genola and Buckman have reservation on the shared services. Mayor Toby Egan stated all entities need to be on board with the shared services. All Council Members agreed that it is important for all entities to be on board with the shared services. City Clerk and RPSWD Board Member Dave Fischer will take the tentative Agreement to the next RPSWD meeting on July 11th and further discuss the Agreement. If the RPSWD Board approves the tentative Agreement, Fischer will bring the Agreement forward to the City Council for further discussion.


PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT:

Pioneer School had approached the Legion Ball Park Committee on their interest in the playground equipment located at the school. The School will be remodeling and plans to get rid of the equipment. Legion Ball Park Committee had discussed that they are not in need of the equipment and that the City might be of some interest. The equipment would be free, the only cost would be to move the equipment and put it back together. City Clerk and Legion Ball Park Committee Member Dave Fischer stated that the Director of Public Works/Parks & Rec, Bob Otremba will get in contact with Superintendent George Weber and further discuss if the equipment would be a good fit. Discussion was held on where the equipment would go. It was discussed that it would fit well at the Park by the Golf Course.
